Finance and Budget—Lion Carol Maynard put together a excel spreadsheet that will automatically categorize credits/debits and then take a 3 year average to give us our budget for following year. First budget report will come for 2025-2026 lionistic year.

Toll Road- Occurred last Friday and was very successful. All members who signed up showed up and we raised the highest total in Club history so far of \$5207.59. We need to look at getting new signs made for next year as the current signs kept getting blown over and are aged. Also need to recruit new committee people to aide chairpersons in setup, teardown, and possibly people management. As usual, the weather was a bit of a challenge.


























