



An LCIF update from PDG Dick Sware District 14D LCIF Coordinator rmsware@icloud.com

First, the good news. East Cocalico Lions Club has 8 named individuals and 1 unnamed individual with money on account with LCIF totaling \$2172.37. Any individual wishing to know what their total with LCIF is can contact the District LCIF Coordinator, PDG Dick Sware at rmsware@icloud.com.

As of January 28, 2025 the District is at 42% of our goal, \$14930 toward our goal of \$30826. The goal is calculated using an average donation of \$30.50 per member.

So far East Cocalico Lions Club has not donated to LCIF for this Lions year, July 1, 2024 - February 17, 2025. That includes individual donations and donations from the club.

There are Presidential Supporter pins available for individual donations. Bronze - A minimum donation of \$50. Silver - A minimum of \$100. Gold - A minimum of \$200. If an individual donates \$200 or more, that individual may receive all 3 pins. I have pins to award and will gladly attend your club meeting to award the pins.

There are also Presidential Supporter pins for the club if the club donates a minimum of \$50 per member based on the club membership on January 1. The levels for the club are Bronze - \$50 per member. Silver - \$100 per member. Gold - \$250 per member. Platinum - \$500 per member. Diamond - \$1000 per member.

Reminder - For every \$1000 that an individual or the club donates, they may designate someone to receive a Melvin Jones Fellowship or a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellowship.


